# **ABOUT THE** CHANGE

NSF has partnered with the National Institutes of Health to use SciENcy: Science Experts Network Curriculum Vitae as an NSF-approved format for use in preparation of the Biosketch and Current and Pending support sections of an NSF proposal.

# WHEN TO CHANGE

The mandate to use SciENcv only for preparation of the biographical sketch and current and pending (other) support will go into effect for new proposals submitted or due on or after October 23, 2023.



## ORCiD

Utilizing ORCiD is an efficient, convenient way to keep biosketches current. Virginia Tech is a premium member of ORCID.
